C. Voisin called the meeting to order at 12:10pm.

Invocation

Philip Malcom from BISCO led the invocation.

Pledge of Allegiance

C. Caillouet led the Pledge of Allegiance.

E. Bergeron called roll. It was noted that Mayor Richard Champagne had called South Central Planning and informed the MPO staff that he would be arriving about 12:30.

Agenda Item # 1

Approval of Minutes from January 8, 2009 Policy Committee Meeting

It was motioned by A. Williams to approve the minutes from the January 8, 2009 meeting, J. Pizzolatto seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Agenda Item # 2

Public Comment

Chairman Voisin asked if there were any public comments.

J. Pizzolatto presented a letter addressed to the MPO from Linda Charpentier of Houma dated on March 9, 2009 and read it into the minutes:

Dear Officials of Terrebonne and Lafourche Metropolitan Planning Organization,

I missed the meeting on Jan. 29, 2009 at the Government Tower. I would like to give my input on the matter.

The Williams Ave. extension from Hwy. 182 to the light at South Hollywood Rd and Williams Ave. extension to the bridge at Dingers Pools needs some improvement. After the canal was dredged, the white lines on the sides of the road are no longer visible. The yellow line in the middle of the road is faded and is hard to see at night. The shoulders of that stretch should be blacktopped; lots of people run off the sides of the road. Please take this into consideration.

Another problem - the twin bridges on New Orleans Blvd., near the twin spans, need proper lighting. It is very hard to see at night while making a left turn from Main St. onto the New Orleans Blvd. Bridge.

Please take these matters into consideration. Thank you.

L. Marretta suggested that the issues raised in the letter would be better directed to Terrebonne Parish Public Works. C. Voisin agreed and J. Pizzolatto said he will bring the letter to their attention.

Chairman Voisin asked if there were any more public comments.

David Gauthé with BISCO addressed the Policy Committee. He said his organization works one-on-one with people to help address problems in the region. He said that

many of the issues that he is asked about seem to be addressed by the Policy Committee. He is excited to see that these issues are being addresses.

Chairman Voisin asked if there were any more public comments.

There being no public comments A. Levron motioned to close comments. P. Matherne seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Agenda Item # 3
Proxy Clarification
Leo Marretta, HTMPO Administrator

L. Marretta reported on the issue of proxy letters raised at the last Policy Committee meeting. He read from Article IV, Section 5 of the By-Laws into the record:

Each member has the right to permanently designate one alternate representative who may serve in the absence of the regular member. If neither the regular or alternate member can attend, a proxy may be designated. The proxy will be valid upon presentation of written authorization from the regular member.

He clarified that this allows for a permanent alternative, who would only need to file a letter once with the South Central Planning office. If someone other than this permanent alternative is to proxy, the individual needs to have a letter in hand or mailed to the office prior to the start of the meeting.

It was motioned by J. Pizzolatto to accept L. Marretta's clarification and seconded by A. Levron. Motion carried unanimously.

Agenda Item # 4
Amendments to the Policy Committee By-Laws and New Intergovernmental Agreement Providing Representation for Assumption and Lockport
Leo Marretta, HTMPO Administrator

L. Marretta explained the purpose of that a segment of Assumption Parish and Lockport fall into the MPO planning area, and they should be given a seat at the table and be involved in the planning process. He referred to the minutes of the last meeting for all previous discussion as well as the outcome that changing the By-Laws would create.

J. Pizzolatto asked if Assumption and Lockport wised to join the MPO. Marretta replied that they have already agreed to join and pay dues.

It was motioned by J. Pizzolatto to accept the By-Law changed and seconded by A. Williams.

C. Voisin asked L. Marretta to notify Assumption and Lockport of their inclusion and the importance of attending the meetings.

Motion carried unanimously.

By-Law Changes:

Article IV, Section 8:

A quorum shall be a total of ~~5 (five)~~ 6 (six) members either present or by proxy.

Article VIII, Section 1, Section 2

The Policy Committee will have a total of ~~eight (8)~~ ten (10) voting members and one (1) nonvoting member.

Section 1. The highest elected officials in the Parishes of **Assumption**, Lafourche and Terrebonne will be automatically appointed to the Policy Committee.

Section 2. The highest elected officials of **The Cities of Lockport** and Thibodaux will automatically be appointed to the Policy Committee.

Agenda Item # 5

LA DOTD Projects Update

Lyle Leblanc, LA DOTD Area Engineer

L. Leblanc updated the committee on DOTD's projects in the Terrebonne-Lafourche area including Leeville Bridge construction, Larose Bridge construction, US 90 overlay completion, overlay of Gheens Road, safety projects on LA 316 and LA 308, LA 315 raise and overlay, LA 56 raise and overlay, Prospect Street Bridge, and more turn lanes on LA 311.

Discussion ensued.

L. Marretta asked the committee if it finds Leblanc's presentations to be beneficial to the MPO. A motion was made by J. Pizzolatto to keep this item on future agendas and a part of the Policy Committee meetings. The motion was seconded by M. Claudet and C. Caillouet. The motion carried unanimously.

Agenda Items # 7 & 8

Present and Finalize ARRA Project Lists for Each Jurisdiction & Amend TIP to Include Policy Committee Approved Projects with New ARRA Funding Category

L. Marretta briefly reviewed the criteria for ARRA projects and the lists sent to him by each jurisdiction. He said the criteria for these projects are that:

- Projects can only be done on roads that are federal-aid eligible. This means they must be classified as Rural Major Collectors and above on the DOTD Highway Functional Classification Map.
- Projects funds must be obligated by March 2, 2010 and abide by the LA DOTD Timeline. Priority will be given to projects that can be completed in three years.
- Projects should have a significant amount of preparatory work already accomplished. Engineering should be at a stage in which the project will be ready to go in one year. Environmental clearance must have been obtained through the National Environmental Protection Act process. The right of way must have been acquired as per the Federal Uniform Relocation Act.

- The sponsoring jurisdiction should be prepared to be responsible to make up the cost of any overages incurred if the project is over budget.
- The sponsoring jurisdiction should be prepared to be responsible for the federal reporting that will be required of the projects.

He then reviewed each parish's pro-rata share of the stimulus funds and the projects submitted.

L. Marretta then reviewed the Good Earth Transit additions to the TIP. He said that GET would receive \$2 million in ARRA funds.

J. Setze said that the Department of Energy and other departments also received stimulus road money, and that the policy committee members should be aware of those options.

At this time, L. Marretta introduced Earl Hicks from the Houma airport and asked him to explain how things are going there. Hicks reported that the airport is growing and running out of property. It is also prone to flooding. He wants to widen and strengthen the main taxi way and is hoping for money from the FAA to do this. He also wanted to widen the runway. The main need, he said, is infrastructure improvements.

L. Marretta asked J. Setze if the airport funds are separate from the MPO funds, to which Setze replied yes. Discussion ensues.

C. Voisin pointed out that Mayor Champagne from Lockport joins the meeting at this time.

L. Marretta then reminded everyone that a TAC meeting was held on March 16, 2009 to review the criteria for the ARRA projects. He requested that each jurisdiction be allowed to present the projects it would like to submit for ARRA funding.

A. Levron, representing Terrebonne Parish, submitted a list of project. While the list was being passed around, Marretta asked the DOTD and FHWA officials to make comments on the submitted projects. J. Setze commented that he thought Thibodaux's maps and projects, drafted by B. Lafont, would meet all federal requirements if they were turned in.

J. Pizzolatto asked what entity makes the final call on ARRA projects. J. Setze answered that the MPO voting board makes all final decisions as to which projects are funded, but they still must meet all federal requirements.

A. Levron said that Terrebonne divided the projects up into three different types of projects – concrete repairs, asphalt overlays, and turning lanes – and followed all criteria in the selection of those projects. He said, however, that the parish would still like the flexibility to amend this list if necessary. He said the MPO's current list of projects with what he would like to submit, with the addition of turn lanes LA 660 at LA 24 and Howard Ave. at Main St.

L. Marretta asked J. Setze about the legality of listing the funding for the three categories and then listing the individual projects without specific funding as Terrebonne had done. Setze said the TIP needs to be more specific by June 16th. Marretta then asked if Terrebonne's list could still be placed in the TIP and substituted later. Setze replied that can happen, but only if the backup project can meet all deadlines. Discussion ensued.

J. Setze concluded that Terrebonne's list is sufficient for now, but it will need to be more specific by the May 14th Policy Committee meeting. A. Levron said Terrebonne will come back with specific numbers at that meeting.

M. Claudet asked if the parish would be responsible for extra projects they place in the TIP if the funding is exceeded. For example, he said, if Terrebonne places seven turn lanes in the TIP, but ARRA funds are used up with five. M. Stack suggested overestimating the costs for each project, but having a ready-list of back up projects that will be ready-to-go as money becomes available. L. Marretta asked if this "ready-list"

should go in the fiscally-constrained TIP. J. Setze answered that back-up projects could be listed for informational purposes without the MPO being obligated to fund them. Discussion ensued.

T. Arabie, representing Lafourche Parish, then presented the projects Lafourche Parish would like to submit for ARRA funds. He said the options are limited as Lafourche does not have many Federal-Aid eligible roads. He requested to remove Plantation Road and Lafort bypass from the previous list submitted, and add LA 1 just south of US 90 to Walmart, to overlay and created a 3-lane section with left-turn lanes and a painted median. He also submitted Tiger Drive overlay and turning lanes on LA 1 and 308 at Canal, Tiger, Audubon and Jackson.

L. Marretta asked if it would be possible for a road to be re-classified as eligible for federal-aid for the stimulus money. J. Setze replied that the FHWA will not consider any road to be reclassified until the 2010 census.

C. Caillouet, representing Thibodaux, presented the projects Thibodaux would like to submit for ARRA funds. He submitted:

- Audubon Dr Overlay (S. Acadia to Erwin Dr) - \$89,285
- Menard St Overlay (Audubon to Goode) - \$185,122
- Ridgefield Rd Overlay (LA 1 to Plantation Rd) - \$259,098
- Tiger Dr Overlay (LA 1 to Parish Rd) - \$214,910
- Acadia Road Pedestrian Walkway (Bayou Lane to LA 648) - \$235,000

Caillouet then pointed out that both Thibodaux and Lafourche parish would like to overlay different segments of Tiger Drive. He asked if there would be any issue with that. J. Setze replied that it would be okay to package roads together, as the ARRA money goes to the MPO, not technically the individual jurisdictions.

R. Champagne, representing Lockport, presented the projects the town would like to submit for ARRA funds. He submitted LA 1 lighting and signage improvements, and a turning lane on LA 1.

L. Leblanc, representing Assumption Parish, presented the projects the parish would like to submit for ARRA funds. He recommended turning lanes on LA 1 and LA 398.

L. Marretta requested that each jurisdiction send him their official lists on letterhead, but suggested the Policy Committee vote to approve the projects listed.

A motion was made by A Williams to amend the TIP to include the projects submitted by each jurisdiction during this meeting. C. Caillouet seconded.

A. Levron asked if there would be a need for a public hearing. L. Marretta answered that all the proper procedures took place for this meeting to be the public hearing.

Motion carried unanimously.

L. Marretta passed around the FHWA's suggested table of contents for the next UPWP to inform the committee as to what the next UPWP will look like. A. Levron asked if the MPO is at risk of losing any funds. J. Setze answered that the FHWA just wants the MPO's to follow the same format, but they are not at risk of losing funds.

M. Stack said that everyone will need to work in cooperation with DOTD for the extensive reporting required by ARRA.
